We believe that goodness simply requires action!


























#### **WATER FOR AFRICA**

- ✓ Water is essential for life on the planet.
- Many communities do not have access to clean water. Deep holes are dug and water totally unfit for consumption is used by the local population.
- Families walk miles daily carrying buckets to get some clean water from the wells that have been drilled.
- Currently the FWB has 19 wells drilled in the centres in Mozambique.
  However, 4 of them are not producing safe drinking water.
- The driest region of our centers in Mozambique is **Chicualacuala**, and we have four centers that still don't have artesian wells.





#### **CURRENT ARTESIAN WELLS**





Artesian well in Mahatlane (**Chicualacuala** region) - water for 559 people



Artesian well in Cuacuene (Manjacaze region) - water for 414 people



Artesian well in Dingue (**Chicualacuala** region) - water for 317 people



Artesian well in Machanganhane (Macia region) - water for 503 people



Artesian well in Muzumuia (Chókwe region) - water for 1277 people



# ACTION -WATER FOR AFRICA -**ARTESIAN WELLS IN** CHICUALACUALA REGION



#### **CHICUALACUALA REGION- CONTEXT**



- ✓ The region is located on the border of Mozambique, South Africa and Zimbabwe.
- Chicualacuala has a land that in recent decades has undergone an intense process of desertification, combined with dry seasons, causing a tragedy for subsistence agriculture and increasing hunger.
- ✓ The FWB started building centers there in 2016, and currently we have 14 centers.
- However, due to the long distance and harsh conditions of the region and especially in some centers, we need more resources to improve our service and alleviate the lack of water and food for the residents.







#### **ARTESIAN WELL FOR CHICUALACUALA - COST AND BENEFITS**



- ✓ We current need to drill 4 artesian wells in the Chicualacuala region. The centers are: Bobobo, Chicualacuala B, Chitlavanine and Mugugu.
- ✓ This region is known to be **extremely dry**, thus the **artesian well is vital** for the life of the beneficiaries
- ✓ The drilling in this case is more complex due to the soil type, also it requires to make a soil study to find where is the best location for finding water. The cost of this study is USD 800.
- ✓ This artesian well will be drilled in a rocky soil, which makes the drilling more difficult and expensive.
- ✓ The cost of drilling in this region is around USD 46,000

Each artesian well will benefit approximately 3,000 people, as the artesian well can be used by the entire community, not just the children.


